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## BAY RESTORATION FUND (BRF) INSTRUCTIONS CHECKLIST FOR THE BEST AVAILABLE TECHNOLOGY (BAT)

LDATE	STEP 1: SUBMIT A BRF APPLICATION AND A COPY OF YOUR FEDERAL INCOME TAX RECORD
Submit a copy o	f your most recent federal income tax record with your <u>BRF Grant Application</u> . The first page of the federal form 1040
for each individu deleted. Homeo	ual listed on the deed must be provided to Environmental Health. Social Security and bank account numbers should be wners with adjusted gross incomes up to \$300,000 per year <u>may be</u> eligible for up to 100% funding. If the BAT unit exceeds the maximum allowable grant, the property owner is responsible for the cost difference. Homeowners with
	than \$300,000 per year may be eligible for up to 50% funding. Just because you may be eligible for 100% funding
does <u>not</u> guaran	tee funds are available.
DATE	STEP 2: SUBMIT APPLICATION FOR SANITARY CONSTRUCTION PERMIT
	the application for Sanitary Construction Permit (fees are NOT covered by the BRF) and schedule a site visit with the
area Environme	ntal Health Specialist. <u>Drainfield is not covered by BRF, unless approved under low income criteria &amp; funds are available</u>
DATE	STEP 3: SELECT A BEST AVAILABLE TECHNOLOGY UNIT (BAT)

DATE	STEP 4: PROVIDE A VENDOR SIGNED FIXED COST CONTRACT
DATE	STEP 5: WAIT AND RECEIVE THE BAY RESTORATION FUND GRANT AWARD LETTER
Bay Restoration	grant funds are administered based on a priority system found in the MDE Guidance Document. Individual grants are
awarded based	on the applicant meeting the program's eligibility requirements and the availability of funds. A waiting list will be
created if the nu	mber of eligible projects exceeds the availability of funds. Based on the availability of funds, Environmental Health will
send you a BAY	RESTORATION FUND GRANT AWARD LETTER. The Bay Restoration Fund Grant Award Letter certifies that funds are
available for the	installation of a BAT unit on your property for a specified time period.
THE BAT UNIT	MUST BE INSTALLED WITHIN 6 (SIX) MONTHS OF RECEIPT OF THE BID AWARD LETTER OR JUNE 30 <sup>TH</sup> (END
	OF GRANT PERIOD); WHICHEVER COMES FIRST.
DATE	STEP 6: SIGN AND RECORD THE BRF EASEMENT & AGREEMENT
The BRF Easeme	ent Agreement will be mailed to you with the Award Letter. The agreement is a legal document that you record in the
Caroline County	Land Records. Do not record if the Health Department has <b>NOT</b> signed this document. The Sanitary Construction
Permit is typical	ly issued after the Agreement is recorded.
DATE	STEP 7: LICENSED SEPTIC CONTRACTOR SCHEDULES INSTALLATION
Prior to installat	ion, your contractor is responsible for having a permit and notifying the Environmental Health Department 24 hours
prior to BAT inst	allation. Environmental Health and a manufacturer representative will inspect the BAT unit to ensure it complies with
manufacturer ar	nd state requirements.
DATE	STEP 8: VENDOR PAYMENT
The approved ve	endor must submit an invoice to Environmental Health for payment. Payment will be made to the approved vendor
based on the gra	ant award amount.
